Attendance Policy

We understand that sometimes students need to be away from school. It is expected that Kathie (Office Manager) is notified of any absences ASAP.

If your child is absent from school with no reasonable explanation, and Kathie cannot get hold of you, after 3 days your child will be marked as truant.

If your child's absence rate reaches 20% in one term (10 days in a term) you will be contacted by your child's teacher by phone and/or a letter will be sent home to raise awareness of the impact on achievement and social relationships.

If absences continue, a second letter will be sent home. A meeting will be requested with you, your child's teacher and Deputy Principal or Principal, to explore possible support within the school, i.e. Health Nurse.

If your child's attendance remains of concern, a third letter will be sent home with a copy of your child's attendance record and sections 20, 25 and 29 of the Education Act 1989. Another meeting will be requested with your child's teacher and Deputy Principal or Principal, to explore possible support within the school, i.e. Health Nurse.

If there is no change, or the meetings were not attended, a referral to Attendance Services will be made by the school.

Supporting Social Skills

As always, if your child is having any issues with their friendships or social skills, please arrange a time to meet with your child's teacher. It is important that a partnership is formed between the caregivers and staff so that we can better meet the needs of our kids.
