

Fraser Crescent School (2844)

ENROLMENT SCHEME

Home Zone

All students who live at an address within the home zone **described below*** (and shown on the map) shall be entitled to enrol at Fraser Crescent School.

Western boundary

The western boundary encompasses all of Riverstone Terraces (off Kirton Drive). The boundary continues from the intersection of Kirton Drive and Moonshine Hill Rd, to the intersection of Moonshine Hill Rd and River Rd on SH2.

Addresses on Moonshine Hill Rd are not in zone.

Heading north, the boundary continues along SH 2 turning east to the intersection with Gibbons St, and then to the intersection of Gibbons St with McLeod St, and Riverbank St.

Northern boundary

The northern boundary continues east along Gibbons St (both sides) to the roundabout with Main St.

Streets to the north of Gibbons St are not in zone including Victoria St, McParland St (up to and including 48 McParland St are out of zone), and Independent Lane.

Eastern boundary

From the roundabout at the intersection of Gibbons St and Main St, the eastern boundary continues south along Main St to the intersection with Fergusson Drive.

Southbound, both sides of Fergusson Drive from 813 to 651 (odd) and from 794 to 648 (even) are in zone including Fraser Crescent, Keys St, Golders Rd, Whakatiki St, Hildreth St and Argyle Grove.

Streets to the east of the Fergusson Drive boundary are not in zone including Blenheim St, Benzie Ave, Richmond St, Ward St and Fortune Lane.

Southern boundary

From the intersection of 651 Fergusson Drive and 1 Milton St, the southern boundary runs west along both sides of Milton St to the intersection with Shakespeare Ave and then south along Shakespeare Ave to the intersection of 86 Shakespeare Ave with 78 Moonshine Rd.

Byron St and Longfellow St are in zone.


All addresses in Shakespeare Ave are in zone.

All addresses in Sheridan Crescent and Thackeray St are not in zone.

The boundary then continues south along Moonshine Rd to the intersection with River Rd on SH 2. House numbers 78, 80, 82, 84, 86, 88 Moonshine Rd are in zone.

Holdsworth Ave is not in zone.

Proof of residence of a property within the home zone will be required (for example a copy of a utility bill with the name of a parent or guardian and an address within the home zone, covering the date of enrolment or earlier). Where a property has two or more entrances on different streets, or where the actual address of a property is in dispute, only the rateable address as recognised by the Upper Hutt City Council will be considered to determine if the property is in or out of zone.

Twice each year, applications for enrolment from in-zone students will be sought 3 weeks before the end of terms 2 and 4. These dates will be published at least two months before the end of terms 2 and 4, in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school and on the school website. This will enable the Board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone during the last month of term.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Every 6 months the Board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following 6 month period for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school and on the school website. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and specify a date by which all applications must be received. The notice may indicate how many places are available.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

First Priority	This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary.
Second Priority	Must be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
Third Priority	Must be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
Fourth priority	Must be given to applicants who are children of former students.
Fifth priority	Must be given to applicants who are either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
Sixth priority	Must be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989.

Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
