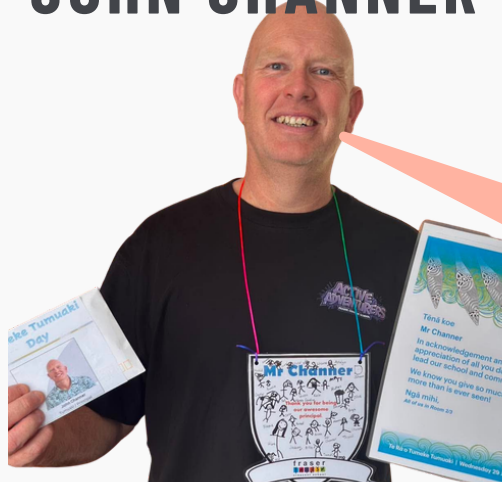

Earlier this week, we held our Values Assembly, as we begin focusing on our **Active Adventurer** value over the next few weeks. This value is about much more than just sport, so I thought I would explain what it means at Fraser Crescent School.

One important aspect of being an Active Adventurer is staying physically active. With technology and gaming increasingly competing for children's time, opportunities to develop motor skills, coordination and fitness through active play and sport can sometimes be limited. We want to encourage all children to enjoy being active and discover the many benefits that come with it. One way we do this is through our **Active Adventurer Club**, which runs every **Tuesday morning** from **7:45 am**. 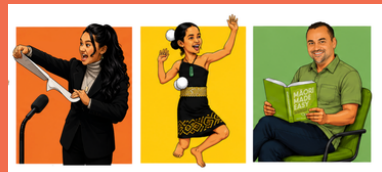


Sarah B is an Active Adventurer by embracing a new country, curriculum and culture with an amazing attitude. She loves to get involved!

On **photo day**, children will be **given a unique link** for their photos to be used when ordering online.

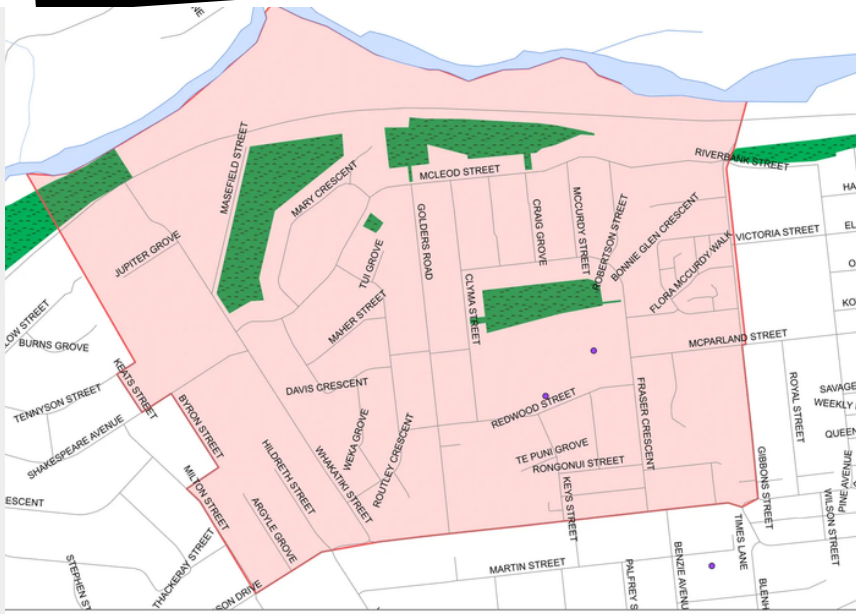
