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Students will understand that...

- Students will understand the UN sustainable goals and how they can invoke change in their communities.

-Contribute to and use simple guidelines and practices that promote physically and socially healthy classrooms, schools, and local environments.

- The changes people make to places can have long-term environmental impacts on those places, the people who live there, and on global processes such as climate change.

-Describe how natural features are changed and resources affected by natural events and human actions.

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Identity & Whanaungatanga

Students will understand that...

-People express their culture through their daily lives.

-Places have special meaning for individuals and groups. People feel connected to these places in different ways

-Identify personal qualities that contribute to a sense of self-worth.

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Enterprise & Innovation

Students will understand that...

-We ask questions about our world that lead to investigations and understand that there may be more than one explanation.

-Models are used to explore, test, and evaluate design concepts for potential outcomes.

-Investigate simple situations that involve elements of chance by comparing experimental results.

-Create a financial plan for short term and long term saving based on individual /whānau/ group goals.

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Culture & Diversity

Students will understand that...

-Describe how individuals and groups share characteristics and are also unique.

-It is important to learn our national languages and that they have many commonalities.

- Understand and celebrate the diverse abilities, languages, identities, and talents of every individual

-People's cultural practices can vary but reflect similar purposes.

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Community & Citizenship

Students will understand that...

-People belong to groups and have roles and responsibilities that help sustain these groups.

-Communities create rules for belonging and systems to maintain order.

- Living things are suited to their particular habitat and how they respond to environmental changes, both natural and human-induced.

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Cause & Effect

Students will understand that...

-There are factors that affect personal, physical, social, and emotional growth and develop skills to manage changes.

-Explore, describe, and represent patterns and trends from everyday examples of physical phenomena, such as movement, forces, electricity and magnetism, light, sound, waves, and heat.

-There have been defining events which have shaped Aotearoa's unique history.
